Collaborating with patients in recovery: Development of an Opioid Addiction and Recovery Veteran Engagement Board

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INTRODUCTION

The number of Veterans receiving treatment for Opioid Use Disorder (OUD) nearly tripled from 2013 to 2017.ⁱ

The VA is addressing this increase by funding projects that increase treatments for OUD in a variety of settings.

The Opioid Addiction and Recovery Veteran Engagement Board (OAR-VEB) was developed to provide input to these pragmatic projects.




METHOD

Our team worked with local contacts at six other VA locations to recruit potential members for OAR-VEB.

- Recruitment strategies included:
- VA and non-VA outreach
- Advertisements
- Email blasts

Patient engagement boards can support pragmatic research by integrating the voices of patients in recovery. Local relationships are critical to identifying potential members.



RESULTS

22 Veterans expressed interest, 13 were invited to join

- Most (17) of the interested Veterans were identified through local VA outreach.
- Recruitment took place over three months and COVID-19 impacted the kick-off plan.
- The team reached out to recruits every two-weeks to update them on the process.
- Orientation calls were held in May and June and the board began meeting with investigators in July.

CONCLUSIONS

- Ads, email blasts, and reaching out to outside organizations did not yield a high response.
- Identifying local individuals to assist with outreach was key for recruitment.
- Ongoing communication in a method that the participants preferred (text messaging and phone calls) sustained engagement.

DISCUSSION

• Patient engagement boards can be time-consuming to develop but can support pragmatic researchers who want to integrate patient voice but do not have the resources to hire patient consultants.
