



Elva Arredondo: I can share a type of example. Some of the churches had social justice values so we would tailor our messaging around the importance of developing programs that target health disparities.

Qing: You showed the pastors' quotation "Hurting physically or emotionally". How were relational quality and relational education assessed and considered in the family level and church level this cluster RCT? This social network level measure might be important in promoting physical activities and safe, stable and nurturing relationship and environment.

Elva Arredondo: Great question. Agree that assessing social networks would be of tremendous value to church leaders. If we were to demonstrate that the program strengthened the church community, that would be a valuable outcome for our pastors/leaders. We only assessed social support of PA.

Elva Arredondo: Another great question! The pastors did ask my religious background and wanted to understand my intentions. T

Danielle Ostendorf: Excellent presentation! I'm curious if you collected any data on the cost of delivering the program and training the community leaders?

Prajakta Adsul: Bethany, just following up on your questions, did the team also recognize any differences in strategies for "implementation" vs for "sustainability" ? Any examples?

russglasgow: How helpful was the PRISM framework? Were there other key contextual factors not covered in PRISM?

Amy Huebschmann: Based on the input on context of churches that "agree" or "decline" to participate to date, are you starting to identify other "types" of church perspectives that signal a "green light" to participate? For example, churches that are already seeking to develop small groups as part of their mission? (think you had said that -- but are there other emerging elements of context that seem important?)

Qing: Your excellent projects were funded by R21 and R01. Did you know or consider NCI R34 3 years \$450K for 3 years for adaptation and pilot study as a potential funding source?
